As I reflected on some of the things that have transpired in our church, and in our community, I was reminded of a skit that was a regular part of the Hee-Haw variety show that ran on CBS back in the 70's, featuring Roy Clark and Archie Campbell, called "That's Good!"/ "No - That's Bad!". The premise of the comedy skit was that our perceptions of an event can be quite different - depending on whether they are based on our understandings in that moment, or our ability to know what follows. Unfortunately, none of us knows what lies around the next bend in the road of our lives. It could be a large inheritance that we never expected, or a medical diagnosis that we never saw coming. But the constant in all of those things; in all of life's unexpected twists and turns - is that there is One who DOES KNOW!

And the promise He makes to us is this: "No matter what, *I will be there.* It does not matter if you can see My hand at work, or sense Me in the midst of your current circumstances - I AM working for your good. And whether I choose to involve you in my working, or choose you to just be the passive recipient of my blessing - I am not absent, nor am I idle."

What some people perceive to be the destruction of the UMC, others perceive to be a time of pruning - one that will eventually yield a stronger and more vibrant crop of disciples and disciple-makers. While some continue to mourn the loss of friends and family and long-standing relationships, others have perceived the recent changes as an opportunity to welcome new folks into our midst, and into positions of ministry in new and exciting ways. It really does depend on your ability to see beyond the veil; to glimpse what God's heart is for His people, and for their working in the world.

It's not been an easy road to navigate - that's for certain. But in the midst of the turmoil - there have been glimmers of hope, and a strong and steady presence of God's Holy Spirit in our gatherings, and in our work. And that, my friends, is surely something to celebrate!

Boxes of stuffing mix, instant potatoes, cranberry sauce, and dessert items (brownie mix, cake mixes, cans of icing, and cookie mix are always welcome).

We are also grateful to be one of the recipients of our local Boy Scout troop's community canned goods annual collection. Their partnership will help to feed hungry families throughout our area over the winter months.
